

Day 1 - 3: Amboseli National park, Tortilis camp

Transfer to Wilson airport either from your hotel or the international airport and connect with the scheduled flight to Amboseli for your three night stay at Tortilis camp.

Tortilis Camp is named after the flat-topped, umbrella thorn tree, the Acacia Tortilis, and is situated in one of Amboseli's areas of Acacia Tortilis woodland. Amboseli is best known for its unrivalled views of Kilimanjaro, and its large elephant population.

Day 4 - 6: Lewa Wildlife conservancy and Safari camp

Depart Amboseli after breakfast, flying to Wilson Airport and then connecting with the scheduled flight to Lewa Downs. Drive through the Conservancy to Lewa Safari camp, your home for the next three nights.

Lewa Safari Camp has a stunning location within Lewa Wildlife Conservancy, with outstanding game viewing from camp and views of Mt. Kenya to the South and the arid lowlands to the North. The 62,000 acre Lewa wildlife conservancy is home to 10% of Kenya's black rhino population, and the single largest population of Grevy's zebra in the world.

Day 7 - 9: Masai Mara, Elephant Pepper camp

After a short flight from Lewa, you arrive at Masai Mara – world renown for the annual wildebeest migration. Your three night stay at Elephant Pepper camp will be filled with a range of activities. Elephant Pepper Camp is situated in the prime core of the protected Mara North Conservancy wilderness area. In the same location for 20 years, one of the original, very small and exclusive tented camps, Elephant Pepper is located away from other lodges, in the heart of the African bush.

Day 10: Back to Nairobi for departure

After a last game drive in the Masai Mara, fly back to Nairobi on the scheduled flight. Sample one of Nairobi's excellent restaurants before your international flight home.

Kenya lies on the equator, therefore the dry and wet seasons have relatively stable and pleasant temperatures, and allow year round safaris and game viewing. Elephant Pepper Camp is closed in April and May.

Jan, Feb, Mar, early June, October, November and early December are less expensive times to visit.

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
